



Abigail's Angels Bereavement Training Programme

Since starting Abigail's Angels Bereavement Training in 2020 we have provided training to well over 4,000 professionals. This year we delivered 58 Abigail's Footsteps funded training sessions. We funded training for 1630 people, with an average attendance of 28 people per session. Our online training programme continues to be popular, we delivered 27 online sessions to 648 people.

'Say My Baby's Name' Training Roadshow

October






Doubling our runners in the Royal Parks Half Marathon this year, we cheered on 10 fundraisers, who raised **£6,188** as a team.
